



Writing Exercise for Mixed Modals

Task: Write a short essay about your plans for your future career. Use "may," "might," "ought to," and "shall" to express possibilities, intentions, and advice.

Guidelines:

- Start with "In the future, I shall..."
- Discuss at least three aspects of your career plans using each modal:
 - · May to express possibilities.
 - · Might to suggest uncertainty.
 - Ought to for advice you think is important.
 - Shall to indicate your intentions or commitments.
- Use appropriate pronouns like "I," "you," or "we."
